Camping spaces are available with full hookups (please bring an extension cord to connect as sites share an outlet) at the rate of \$35.00/night. Camping will be on a first come, first served basis with paid trial entries. A signed and completed campsite registration form must be filled out when you check in. Complete the campsite form located at the end of the flyer. **The fairgrounds do not allow any open alcoholic beverages.**

Please be sure to put your drink in an unmarked container (bring your Solo cups!). If a county official sees an open alcoholic container, you will be asked to leave. They are very strict about this.

PLEASE READ:

1. All sanctioned classes are open to Jack Russell Terriers only.
2. Exhibitors and owners of terriers entered must be current JRTCA members and must not be a member of a conflicting JRT organization or register their JRTs in any all-breed registry or conflicting JRT organization. If an exhibitor is found to be in violation of this policy, entry will be disqualified and no refunds will be given. If a violation is confirmed after the trial, placements will be voided from all JRTCA records. Exhibitors must submit a completed entry form including a signed waiver for every trial they enter.
3. Entries must be within the 10-15-inch JRTCA height standard for all sanctioned classes (with the exception of pups who have not yet met the 10-inch height standard); measuring devices will be available on the trial grounds.
4. Puppies (under 12 months) are not eligible for championship in any division but their own. Puppies are eligible to compete only if they have reached their four-month birthday (NOT 16 weeks). A puppy's age is the actual age on the day of the trial.
5. Bitches in season may not compete in any division. Pre-entry fees of bitches in season will be refunded with a veterinarian certificate or as otherwise agreed upon by the Trial Administrator.
6. Spayed or neutered terriers may compete in the Miscellaneous Conformation Section only. They may not compete in Puppy, Family*, Open, or Working Conformation. *Note: For Family Classes, Brood Bitches and Stud Dogs entered may not be spayed / neutered. The offspring at their sides may be intact or spayed/neutered.
7. A terrier bred by a sanctioned JRTCA Judge may not be shown under that Judge in the Conformation division.
8. Terriers owned or co-owned by the Trial Chairperson or any member of their household may not be entered in any phase of the competition with the exception of Child and Youth Handling.
9. Terriers owned by judges may not be entered in the division in which they are judging but may enter the competition in any other division.
10. Terriers owned by stewards may be entered in any division provided that they find a substitute to perform their duties or have someone else show their terriers.
11. Requests for the measurement of a terrier entered in any class number may be made only by another exhibitor in that same class number or by the Judge EXCEPT in Racing. Requests for the measurement of a terrier in Racing may be made by the Judge or by an exhibitor with a terrier entered in the same class number; OR, if classes are split by gender, may call for a measurement of a terrier of the opposite gender in the same age and height category. (Example: The owner of an under adult dog entered in Racing may call for the measurement of an under adult bitch as the potential exists for them to race each other in the Championship Races.) Exhibitors racing puppies may call for the measurement of a puppy in a different age category as long as it is in the same height category. The person making the request for measurement must name the terrier or terriers they wish to have measured, but requests for measurement of the entire class will not be honored. The measurement of the terrier will be considered the terrier's official height for the duration of the trial. Only JRTCA height cards issues after September 1999 will be honored.
12. Excessive use of squeaky or fur-like baiting devices by exhibitors is prohibited in the Conformation ring and may result in the exhibitor being excused from the class. "Excessive use" will be at the Judge's discretion.
13. Exhibitors participating in the JRTCA Working Terrier Classes, Certificate Go-To-Ground or Super Earth must submit the appropriate JRTCA certificates with pre-entries or at the time of post entry. The Judge may require a copy of the certificate be presented to the ring/den steward at the time of judging. Registered terriers may submit a copy of NHC certificate signed by a JRTCA Working Judge within 30 days of the date it was issued.

14. Puppies under the age of three months are not permitted on the trial grounds. Any person violating this rule will be excused from all classes entered and asked to leave the trial site. (This applies to RV's or campers, if at the same address as the trial grounds). 01/22
15. All dogs must be leashed or crated except when competition requires off-leash work. No liberty leashes allowed.
16. Overly aggressive dogs or an owner's failure to control his dog may result in disqualification at the discretion of the Judges or the Trial Chairperson.
17. The abuse or severe disciplining of dogs on the trial grounds is prohibited. Anyone displaying such behavior will be asked to leave the trial site, and no entry fees will be refunded.
18. Dogs other than JRTs on the grounds may be excluded or permitted at the discretion of the Trial Administrator.
19. Exhibitors are responsible to be on time for classes entered. No refunds will be given for missed classes.
20. The owner/handler of a terrier entering any class does so at his/her own risk and agrees to abide by the rules of the JRTCA and the trial. A copy of the JRTCA Rule Book can be obtained by contacting the JRTCA office (410-561-3655) or it can be downloaded from the JRTCA website (www.realjackrussell.com)
21. Unsportsmanlike conduct, or the use of foul and abusive language, will not be tolerated. Anyone demonstrating such conduct will be asked to leave the trial site and no entry fees will be refunded. In addition, such conduct will be subject to penalties, which may include the suspension of membership, restriction from entering the JRTCA National Trial, and/or fines. Trial Chairpersons have the right to refuse any entry at their sole and absolute discretion.
22. All dogs brought to JRTCA Sanctioned Trials must be current on vaccinations. No dogs of any age may be brought to a trial who have suspicion of contagious or infectious disease.
23. Judges may not eat, smoke, vape, or use cell phones while judging their event. (01/22)

Please make certain there is a high point sheet in your entry packet.

You will need to keep track of your points for Saturday and Sunday.

At the conclusion of events on Sunday, turn in high points sheets to the trial secretary for verification. The Jacks in June High Point will be awarded to the Jack Russell with the most points from both days.

1st = 6 pts, 2nd = 5 pts, 3rd = 4 pts, 4th = 3 pts, 5th = 2 pts, and 6th = 1 pt.

DIVISION A - RACING

All terriers must be muzzled. Plastic muzzles or close-ended cloth muzzles only. Black, brown clear or white muzzles are acceptable; NO figure eight, open-ended or Baskerville muzzles will be allowed.

Qualifications for Championship Run Offs

- A. Terrier must place first in a flat or hurdle race final to qualify for championship run offs. First to the hole is not necessarily first through the backside of the barrier.
- B. A terrier MUST ENTER AND FINISH in both, at least one flat race AND one hurdle race at the beginning level based on trial entries (heat, semi, final).
- C. A terrier must continue to advance, if qualified, to all additional semi-final heats up to the final championship race. If injured, the terrier is then finished and cannot race in the final.
- D. A FINISHED race is when the terrier runs down the track unassisted (by owner or anyone else) with a secured muzzle to the backside of the barrier.
- E. In the event a terrier does not meet all the above criteria, the second-place terrier in the final of that class (either flats or hurdles) will qualify for the championship run off if they meet the criteria as outlined above.

DIVISION B - CONFORMATION

- Cross entering is not permitted within or between the Open and Working sections.
- Exhibitors participating in the working classes must submit the appropriate JRTCA paperwork with entries. The judge may require a copy of the National Hunting Certificate to be presented to the ring steward at the time of judging.
- Registered terriers may submit a copy of the NHC application signed by a JRTCA working judge, within 30 days of the date it was issued.
- Spayed or neutered terriers may only compete in miscellaneous conformation classes.

Terriers entering the Working Section **may not** cross-enter into the Open Section; no cross-entering is permitted within the Working Section.

- Class 52 Bred by Exhibitor Working Terrier Dog. Open to any Working Jack Russell Terrier owned and bred by the exhibitor *under whose kennel prefix the terrier is registered*; must be handled by the breeder or a member of the breeder's immediate family.
- Class 53 Working Terrier Dog, 10 up to 12½ "

- Class 66 Bred by Exhibitor Dog. Open to any adult Jack Russell Terrier owned and bred by the exhibitor; must be handled by the breeder *under shown kennel prefix the terrier is registered* or a member of the breeder’s immediate family.
- Class 67 Dogs 1 year and older 10” up to 12½ “, smooth
- Class 68 Dogs 1 year and older 10” up to 12½ rough/broken.
- Class 69 Dogs 1 year and older 12½ “up to 15”, smooth
- Class 70 Dogs 1 year and older 12½ “up to 15”, rough/broken

- Class 71 **BEST OPEN AND RESERVE DOG** - Open to 1st and 2nd place winners of Open Dog classes.
- Class 72 Bred by Exhibitor Bitch. Open to any adult Jack Russell Terrier owned and bred by the exhibitor; must be handled by the breeder *under whose kennel prefix the terrier is registered* or a member of the breeder's immediate family.
- Class 73 Bitches 1 year and older, 10" up to 12½", smooth
- Class 74 Bitches 1 year and older, 10" up to 12½ ", rough/broken
- Class 75 Bitches 1 year and older, 12½ "up to 15", smooth
- Class 76 Bitches 1 year and older, 12½ "up to 15", rough/broken.
- Class 77 **BEST OPEN BITCH AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st and 2nd place winners of Open Bitch classes.
- Class 78 **BEST OPEN TERRIER AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st and 2nd place winners of classes 71 & 77

Section 5: FAMILY

- Class 79: **Stud Dog & Get.** Open to sire with at least 2, but not more than 3, offspring at side. Judged on Breed Standard and consistency of type.
- Class 80: **Brood Bitch & Produce.** Open to dam with at least 2, but not more than 3, offspring at side. Judged on Breed Standard and consistency of type.
- Class 81: **BEST FAMILY.** Open to first & second place winners of classes 79 & 80. No entry fees

Section 6: MISCELLANEOUS

- Class 82 Spayed/Neutered Working Terrier. Open to any adult Spayed/Neutered Jack Russell Terrier, who holds a JRTCA Natural Hunting Certificate.
- Class 83 Neutered Dog and Spayed Bitch
- Class 84 Virginia Bred –Open to any adult Jack Russell bred in the State of Virginia.

Section 7: SUITABILITY – Open to any adult Jack Russell Terrier, including those which have been spayed/neutered. The dog the judge would choose to take hunting to each quarry listed below.

Class 85 Suitability to Red Fox.

Class 86 Suitability to Grey Fox.

Class 87 Suitability to Groundhog

DIVISION C: Go To Ground

A timed event that simulates the terrier's natural instinct to hunt. The terrier enters an artificial den/tunnel to demonstrate its working ability. Schooling prior to the competition is not permitted. Terrier may switch from one type of work to another (examples: baying to concentrated stare or digging to baying.) For Championship Certificate classes, a copy of the certificate must be submitted with pre-entry or be shown to the Den Steward at the time of the class. No cross entering between Certificate classes.

Timing is as follows: Novice Puppy & Novice Adult - One minute to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter several times until quarry is reached; must work quarry for 30 seconds without a break in work and without leaving quarry.

Open Puppy & Open Adult - One second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter once until quarry is reached; must work quarry for one minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.

Puppy Championship - One second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter once until quarry is reached; work quarry for one minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.

Championship Certificate Classes - One second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may not leave the earth; work quarry for one minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.

Class 89 **Pre-Novice Puppy.** Open to Jack Russell puppies 4 up to 6 months. Entry in Pre-Novice Puppy class does not affect the puppy's eligibility to enter the Novice Class after 6 months of age. (One minute to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter until quarry is reached; mark quarry for 15 seconds without a break in work and without leaving quarry.)

Class 90 **Novice Puppy.** Open to Jack Russells 6 up to 12 months which have not scored a 100% in this class at a previous JRTCA trial. Entries earning a score of 100% at this trial may, upon payment of the entry fee, enter the Open Puppy Class at this trial. (One minute to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter several times until quarry is reached; when quarry is reached must work quarry continuously for a full 30 seconds without a break in work and without leaving the quarry; may switch from one type of work to another (examples: baying to concentrated stare or digging to baying.)

Class 91 **Open Puppy.** Open to Jack Russells 6 up to 12 months which have scored a 100% in a Novice Go-to-Ground class at this or a previous JRTCA trial. **Not open to any puppy which has competed in Puppy Championship GTG.** Puppies earning a score of of 100% at this trial may, upon payment of the entry fee, enter the Puppy Championship

GTG class at this trial or may continue competing in Open Puppy GTG class at future trials. 1 second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth once and re-enter before quarry is reached; must work quarry continuously for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry; may leave earth once and re-enter before quarry is reached; must work quarry continuously for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving the quarry; may switch from one type of work to another (examples: baying to concentrated stare or digging to baying.)

Class 92 **Novice Adult:** Open to Jack Russells one year of age or older which have not scored 100% in this class at a previous JRTCA trial. Entries earning a score of 100% at this trial may upon payment of the entry fee, enter the Open class at this trial. (One minute to reach quarry; may leave and re-enter several times until quarry is reached; must work quarry continuously for a full 30 seconds without a break in work and without leaving the quarry; may switch from one type of work to another (examples: baying to concentrated stare or digging to baying))

Class 93 **Open Adult:** Open to Jack Russells one year or older which have scored 100% in a Novice Go-to-Ground class at this or a previous JRTCA trial. 1 second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth once and re-enter without a break in work and without leaving quarry; may switch from one type of work to another.) May continue to compete in Open Adult class until they apply for a receive their Trial Certificate. A terrier achieving 100% in the Open Adult Class is eligible to apply for a Trial Certificate if the terrier is registered or recorded with the JRTCA.

Class 94 **Puppy Championship:** Open to Jack Russells 6 up to 12 months which have earned 100% in an Open Go-to-Ground class at this or a previous JRTCA trial. A copy of a 100% Open score sheet shall be submitted with pre-entry or be shown to the Den Steward at the time of class. First and second place winners will be Puppy Go-to-Ground Champion and Reserve. (1 second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth once and re-enter before the quarry is reached; when quarry is reached must work quarry for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry; may switch from one type of work to another.) Once a puppy competes in Puppy Championship GTG, they cannot return to open.

- Class 95 **Adult Championship Certificate: 10" up to 12½"**. Open to any adult Jack Russell 10" up to 12½" one year and over, which holds a JRTCA Trial Certificate. A copy of the certificate must be submitted with pre-entry or be shown to the Den Steward at the time of class. First and second place winners will be Go-to-Ground Champion and Reserve. (1 second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may not leave earth; work quarry for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.)
- Class 96 **Adult Championship Certificate: 12½" up to 15"**. Open to any adult Jack Russell over 12½" up to 15" one year and over, which holds a JRTCA Trial Certificate. A copy of the certificate must be submitted with pre-entry or be shown to the Den Steward at the time of the class. First and second place winners will be Go-to-Ground Champion and Reserve. (1 second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may not leave earth; work quarry for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.)
- Class 97 **Veteran Certificate: 10" up to 12½"**. Open to any adult Jack Russell 6 years of age or older, who holds a JRTCA Trial Certificate. **CROSS-ENTERING IS NOT PERMITTED BETWEEN CERTIFICATE CLASSES.** (1 second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry) not leave earth; work quarry for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.)
- Class 98 **Veteran Certificate: 12½" up to 15"**. Open to any adult Jack Russell 6 years of age or older, who holds a JRTCA Trial Certificate. **CROSS-ENTERING IS NOT PERMITTED BETWEEN CERTIFICATE CLASSES.** (1 second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may not leave earth; work quarry for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.)
- Class 99 **Senior Certificate: 10" up to 12½"**. Open to any adult Jack Russell 9 years of age or older, who holds a JRTCA Trial Certificate. **CROSS-ENTERING IS NOT PERMITTED BETWEEN CERTIFICATE CLASSES.** (1 second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may not leave earth; work quarry for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.)
- Class 100 **Senior Certificate: 12½" up to 15"**. Open to any adult Jack Russell 9 years of age or older, who holds a JRTCA Trial Certificate. **CROSS-ENTERING IS NOT PERMITTED BETWEEN CERTIFICATE CLASSES.** (1 second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may not leave earth; work quarry for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.)

DIVISION D – SUPER-EARTH

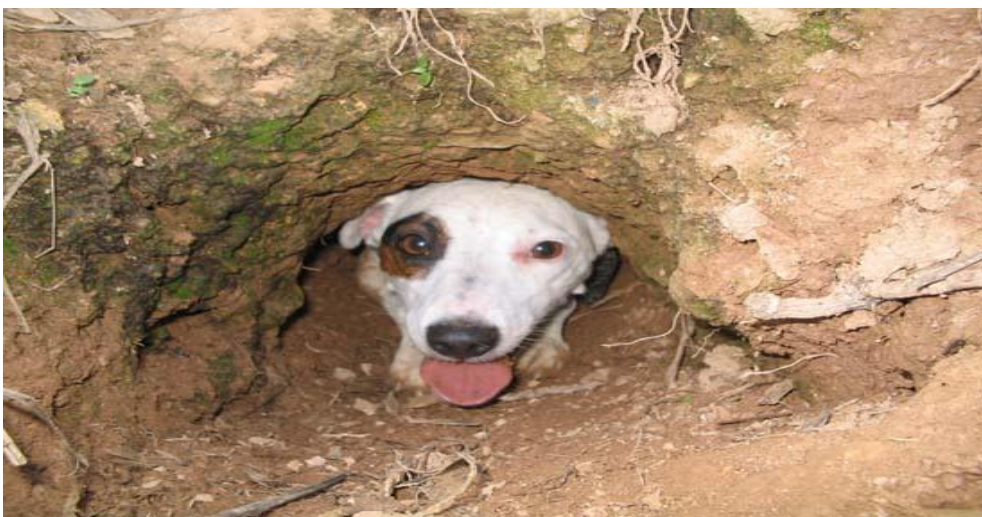
A challenging GTG course with a series of false entrances and/or false tunnels and dens. Open to any Jack Russell Terrier, 6 months and older. Schooling prior to the competition is not permitted. The Terrier may switch from one type of work to another (examples: baying to concentrated stare or digging to baying.)

For Championship Certificate classes, a copy of the certificate must be submitted with pre-entry or be shown to the Den Steward at the time of the class. No cross entering between Certificate classes.

Timing for all Super Earth Classes: One second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave and re-enter the earth multiple times until quarry is reached; work quarry for one minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry. Terrier is not to leave quarry once it is reached. Classes may be combined as entries warrant.

- Class 101 Open Puppy Super Earth: Open to Jack Russell Terrier puppies, 6 up to 12 months. Puppies earning a score of 100% at this trial may, upon payment of the entry fee, enter the Puppy Championship Super Earth class at this trial OR may continue competing in Open Puppy Super Earth class at future trials. Open Puppy Super Earth is not open to any Puppy which has competed in Puppy Championship Super Earth.
- Class 102 Open Adult Super Earth: 10" up to 12½". Open to Jack Russells, one year and older.
- Class 103 Open Adult Super Earth: Over 12½" up to 15". Open to Jack Russells, one year and older.
- Class 104 Open Veteran Super Earth: 10" up to 12½". Open to Jack Russells, six years and older.
- Class 105 Open Veteran Super Earth: Over 12½" up to 15". Open to Jack Russells, six years and older.
- Class 106 Puppy Championship Super Earth: Open to Jack Russell Terrier puppies, 6 up to 12 months, which have earned 100% in an Open 6 up to 12-month Puppy Super Earth Class at this or a previous JRTCA Trial. A copy of a 100% score sheet must be presented with pre-entry or be shown to den steward at the time of the class. First and second place winners will be Puppy Super Earth Champion and Reserve.

- .Class 107 Adult Championship Certificate Super Earth: 10" up to 12½" . Open to Jack Russell Terriers, one year and older, which hold a JRTCA Super Earth Trial Certificate. First and Second Place winners will be Adult Super Earth Champion and Reserve.
- Class 108 Adult Championship Certificate Super Earth: Over 12½" up to 15". Open to Jack Russell Terriers, one year and older, 12½" up to 15", which hold a JRTCA Super Earth Trial Certificate. First and Second Place winners will be Adult Super Earth Champion and Reserve.
- Class 109 Veteran Championship Certificate Super Earth: 10" up to 12½". Open to Jack Russell Terriers, six years and older, 10" up to 12½" which hold a JRTCA Super Earth Trial Certificate. First and Second Place winners will be Veteran Super Earth Champion and Reserve.
- Class 110 Veteran Championship Certificate Super Earth: 12½ to 15". Open to Jack Russell Terriers, six years and older, 12½" up to 15", which hold a JRTCA Super Earth Trial Certificate. First and Second Place winners will be Veteran Super Earth Champion and Reserve.
- Class 111 Senior Championship Certificate Super Earth: 10" up to 12½". Open to Jack Russell Terriers, nine years and older, 10" up to 12½", which hold a JRTCA Super Earth Trial Certificate. First and Second Place winners will be Veteran Super Earth Champion and Reserve.
- Class 112 Senior Championship Certificate Super Earth: 12½ to 15" . Open to Jack Russell Terriers, nine years and older, 12½ to 15", which hold a JRTCA Super Earth Trial Certificate. First and Second Place winners will be Senior Super Earth Champion and Reserve.



DIVISION E – TRAILING AND LOCATING

The terrier is judged on his ability to follow a line in a simulated natural hunting environment, to locate, mark and open on the quarry. The terrier is judged on a combination of time and accuracy.

- The handler must remain at the starting area.
- No directional hand signals allowed.
- The handler may use verbal commands to praise or recall the terrier.
- The length of the course is a minimum of 50 steps with at least two, but not more than four, changes in direction.
- The trail is scented before the competition, at least 30 minutes prior to the competition for the scent to dry to the vegetation and the ground. The preferable scent is a mixture of rat urine, water and unscented glycerin. Use fox urine only if a fox is the quarry.
- No schooling is permitted in area prior to the competition starting.
- Flags are not to be used to mark the course.
- The terrier is judged on his ability to follow a line in a simulated natural hunting environment, to locate, mark and open on the quarry.
- The terrier is judged on a combination of time and accuracy. The terrier with the fastest time is not necessarily the winner.
- The starting point is a natural marked spot indicated by the Judge.
- The end is a natural marked spot approximately 2-3 feet from the actual quarry. The terrier's time is clocked up until he comes to this spot. This is considered coming up to the quarry for this test.

Additions of 1-15 seconds are taken for the following:

- Backtracking: Runs back over the line/scented trail.
- Overrunning: Overruns the line at a sharp turn; the harder the drive, the more the correction has to be made.
- Weaving: Runs from side to side of the line.
- Swinging: Races in wide circles in hit or miss fashion. Does not follow line directly. Skirts cover, sloppy work.
- Pottering/Loafing: Mucking about on line, goes over line again. Makes check/change of direction where none exists. Lacks animation. Swings off line at start of check, then waits for someone to find line. Pees on bushes, pokes in holes, wastes time.
- Babbling: Opens/barks inappropriately off the line or on other game.
- Quitting: Should be taken off trail and disqualified. • Handler Error: Misleads or distracts terrier. Does not follow orders/rules.
- Switching Quarry: Dog swings off line completely. Dog runs other quarry/trail.
- Deductions of 1-15 points are taken for the following:
- Marking Quarry: Should come up to quarry: points off for not going the whole way.

BONUS: 10 seconds off time if dog opens on quarry.

Class 113 Puppies: up to 12 months: 10" up to 15"

Class 114 Adults: 1-5 years: 10" up to 15"

Class 115 Veterans: 6 years: 10" up to 15"

Class 116 Seniors: 9 years: 10" up to 15"

Class 117 High Point and Reserve High Point is the best time of the day with the least number of deductions. Reserve High Point is the reserve best time of the day with the second least number of deductions.



DIVISION F – LURE COURSING (Non-Sanctioned)

Class 118 Puppies: 6-9 months, 10" up to 12 ½"

Class 119 Puppies: 6-9 months, over 12 ½" up to 15"

Class 120 Puppies: 9-12 months, 10" up to 12 ½"

- **JUDGE** determines when the terrier locates and/or works the quarry

DIVISION H – TNT TUNNEL (NON-SANCTIONED)

This is a timed event/competition with the terrier working its way through a tunnel maze that may have dead ends and obstacles to maneuver. The tunnel has a clear side so you can see the progress of your terrier as it makes its way to the caged quarry. The terrier runs the tunnel twice; the best time is the final time that counts towards placement.

Class 145 Puppies: 4 months up to 12 months.

Class 146 Adults: up to 6 year

Class 147 Veterans: 6+ years

Class 148 Seniors: 9+ years

Class 149 TNT Champion and Reserve will be determined by 1st and 2nd fastest times of the day.

DIVISION I – BALL TOSS (SATURDAY ONLY) (NON-SANCTIONED)

Ball toss is a timed event. Three (3) tosses with the best time recorded. Ball is tossed a specific distance; the dog must retrieve the ball back over the start/finish line with each toss/retrieval timed. A variety of you may use your dog's "favorite" ball.

Class 150 Puppies, 6 up to 12 months

Class 151 Adult 1 year and older, 10" up to 12 ½"

Class 152 Adult, 1 year and older, 12½" up to 15"

Class 153 Veteran, 6 years and older,

Class 154 Senior, 9 years and older

Class 155 Championship and Reserve: awarded to the 2 terriers with the top two fastest retrieval times



DIVISION J – CHILD AND YOUTH

Exhibitors must compete in a minimum of Youth Handling and Youth Go-to-Ground to qualify for the Youth High Score and Reserve. A tie will be broken with the final decision made by a Conformation Judge other than the Judge of the day. The tiebreaker takes place in the conformation ring and is determined at the Judge's discretion by the exhibitor's handling/presentation of his/her terrier, by the answers to the Judge's questions, or by a combination of the two.

- Class 156 **Child Handler.** Open to any youth aged 5 through 9, handling a Jack Russell Terrier, six months of age or older. This class is offered as an introductory experience in handling and learning about the Jack Russell Terrier. Judged on child's ability to present his/her dog and beginning knowledge of the Jack Russell. Quality of the dog NOT to be considered.
- Class 157 **Youth Handler.** Open to any youth aged 10 through 16, handling an adult Jack Russell Terrier. Judged on the youth's ability to present his/her dog and knowledge of the Jack Russell Terrier. Quality of the dog NOT to be considered.
- Class 158 **Youth Working Judge's Choice.** Open to any youth handler aged 10-16 handling an adult JRT. Judged on the youth's knowledge of hunting and the working terrier and ability to answer questions presented by a JRTCA Working Judge; no terrier to accompany handler in class.
- Class 159 **Youth Go-to-Ground.** Open to any youth aged 10 through 16 handling an adult JRT. Judged on the youth's ability to present his/her dog and knowledge of Go-to-Ground. To be run through the 10-foot Novice liner; time not to be considered.
- Class 160 **YOUTH Handler High Score and Reserve**
Awarded to the highest scoring youth and runner-up in classes 157, 158 and 159. The points are awarded as follows: 1st = 8 points; 2nd = 6 points; 3rd = 5 points; 4th = 4 points; 5th = 3 points; 6th = 2 points; and participation = 1 point.

CHESTERFIELD COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS RENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES AND FIREARMS.** Alcoholic beverages, illegal substances shall **NOT** be brought or consumed on park properties. No illegal possession of weapons is allowed on Chesterfield County Park Property. Any person believed to be intoxicated, under the influence of illegal substances or illegally possessing a weapon shall be excluded from the property.
- 2. An off-duty Chesterfield County Police Officer will be required for any event for youth between 14-20 paid directly by the applicant will be required for all facility uses for participants 12-18 years of age. In addition, there must be one adult chaperone for every fifteen participants. If deemed necessary, an additional staff will be required and an additional fee charged to the applicant.**
3. Any false information on the fairground rental application is cause for immediate end of use and the applicant and their guests must leave the premises immediately.
4. If the police are called as the result of any misconduct of the applicant or their guests the rental will end immediately and the applicant and all their guests shall be required to leave the premises immediately.
5. **ATTENDANCE BY A RESPONSIBLE PERSON.** A responsible person shall be at all functions held within park facilities. Such a person shall work cooperatively with park personnel to insure proper care of property and enforcement of park regulations. Applicant accepts responsibility for any damages that might occur during the period of use. The applicant agrees to save the County harmless from all claims for injuries of persons incurred while using the department facilities.
6. **CROWD LIMITATION.** Attendance shall be limited to the number stated on the fairground rental application. The applicant shall be directly responsible to the Fire Prevention Bureau for infractions.
7. **GROUNDS AND PROPERTY.** County property shall not be moved or removed from premises. The Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to inspect the premises during any activity. Supplies provided for rentals include **tables and chairs** only. Any user leaving the facility unattended will be held responsible for any damage or theft that occurs. The user shall not modify or change the heating or cooling in affect during the building use.
8. **GROUP RESPONSIBILITIES.** The organization/individual using the facility shall be responsible for the proper conduct of persons in attendance and the care and cleanup of property which includes taking down all tables and chairs, putting them in storage and sweeping the floor. An adult must closely supervise all children. Fairgrounds usage shall be limited to the area(s) reserved by the group/individual.
9. **SIGNAGE/DECORATIONS OR STAGING.** Signage/decorations must be installed and removed so as not to deface or damage any park/building property. User **MUST** remove all signage/decorations before leaving the premises. Special equipment, such as lights, amplifiers, tents, mechanical rides, etc. is not permitted without a Special Events Permit. Balloons must be secured to a stationary object at all times, while inside the facility.
10. **PARKING.** Parking of vehicles on park grounds shall be confined to approved areas and users shall adhere to all traffic regulations in effect at that park. **Please do not park in front of maintenance roads or trails.**
11. **PETS.** Animals needed to provide assistance to persons with disabilities will be permitted to enter. Pets must be kept on a leash.
12. **Smoking Policy.** The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Building is a smoke-free facility.
13. **Fees/Charges:** Non-profit groups may conduct fund raising activities. Private and for-profit groups may not charge fees or charges.
14. **Refunds:** Refunds will be granted until two (2) weeks prior to the reservation date and must be requested in writing to the Parks and Staff contact. No refunds will be issued after this time. There will be a \$25 processing fee on all refunds. Refunds will not be granted for inclement weather unless the department closes the facility.
15. **Date Changes:** All requests for date changes must be put in writing and received at the parks and recreation administration office at least two (2) weeks prior to the original reservation date. Date changes are limited to availability.
16. **Outside Facilities.** Any use of the Chesterfield County Fairgrounds may require a special events permit.
17. **Check-Out Policy.** The using organization/individual is responsible for the fairgrounds and its contents during use.
18. **Rental Time:** Your use of the facility is for the exact time you pay to rent. There is no time provided before to set up and no time after provided for cleanup. You must pay to rent the facility for these purposes. The Fairgrounds will only be open during the exact hours for which you have paid to rent the facility.
19. **Extended rental time:** You will only be able to pay to extend your rental time during regular operating hours. Extended hours must be paid for two weeks prior to your rental date.

Chesterfield County Fairgrounds is equipped with campsites to accommodate overnight stays. Use of the campground is included with any reservation of the Fairgrounds.

All individuals camping overnight, whether in a tent or RV, must use marked, designated campsites. Event organizers will be supplied with a Campsite Map that shows a detailed map and description of available campsites. The event organizer (renter) may determine who gets which campsite, but every camper must be in a designated campsite.

The event organizer (renter) is responsible for ensuring all campers complete a Campsite Registration Form (attached). It is the responsibility of the renter to collect these Campsite Registration Forms and provide them to Chesterfield Parks and Recreation Staff. Parks and Recreation Staff will collect forms daily at the Fairgrounds, as needed.

The renter must ensure that all campers abide by the following Campground Rules and Regulations:

- All campers (RV and tent campers) are required to fill out a campground registration form.
- Only persons 18 years or older may register for a campsite. The registrant is responsible for the occupants of the campsite.
- The Event Organizer must collect all campsite registration forms and make copies available to the Parks and Recreation staff.
- Camping is only allowed in marked, designated campsites.
- All camping equipment must be set up within the parameters of campsite.
- Occupancy of each campsite shall be limited to not more than 6 persons or immediate family.
- No visitors shall be allowed between 10 p.m. and 8 a.m.
- Quiet hours shall be from midnight to 7 a.m.
- Restraints are not to be attached to park structures, trees or vegetation. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets and to ensure pets do not disturb other campers.
- Ground fires are not permitted.
- Do not cut or scar any plants or trees.
- Alcohol Beverages are prohibited.
- Fireworks are prohibited.
- Litter and garbage should be deposited in the trash dumpsters provided or taken out of the campgrounds with you.
- A dump station is provided at Gate 4 for the proper disposal of wastewater.

Event Organizers may impose additional campground rules with the approval of Chesterfield Parks and Recreation.

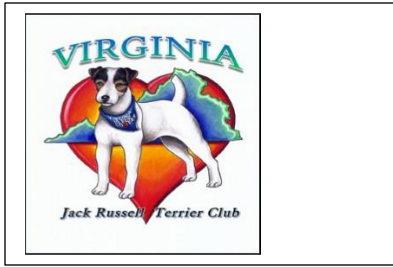
